ARRIVAL, CATTLE MARKET OR BURANA TOWER, CHON-KEMIN VILLAGE

Salam and welcome to Kyrgyzstan! Most of our trips begin on a Sunday, which means you'll get to experience a truly local highlight: the bustling cattle and horse market, where traders and buyers from surrounding villages gather for trade. On other days, we visit the Burana Tower, a remnant of the ancient city of Balasagun, and a UNESCO world heritage site.

From there, we set off toward the captivating Chon Kemin Valley, renowned for its beauty. Along the way, we stop at a panoramic viewpoint where two rivers merge, a striking natural landmark.

After lunch and check-in at a family-run guesthouse, take a short rest before exploring village life the traditional way, by horse cart. Wave to locals, breathe in the crisp mountain air, and if you're lucky, catch a blacksmith at work fitting horseshoes. After a sumptuous local dinner, gather around the campfire for stargazing, stories, and the warm feeling that you've truly arrived in Kyrgyzstan.

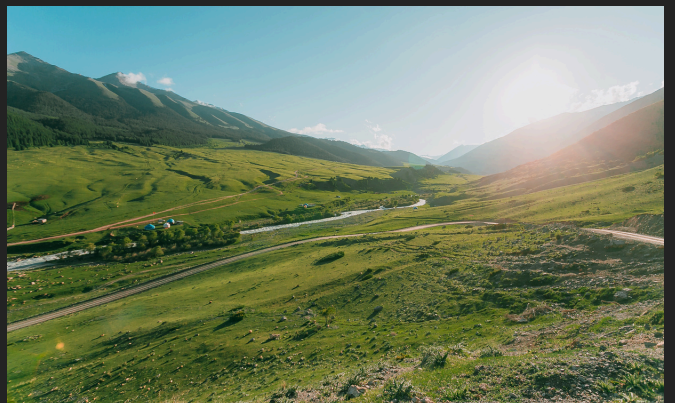
RAFTING, ISSYK-KUL, KARKOL & DUNGAN DINNER

Kick off the day with one of the early highlights of the trip, a fun and beginner-friendly rafting adventure down the Chu River. With helmets, vests, and guides, you'll be well equipped to enjoy the ride. As the river winds its way through a wide valley, soak in the fresh air and dramatic scenery, a shared thrill that sets the tone for the group adventure ahead. For smaller private groups, a leisurely boat ride on Issyk Kul is a relaxing alternative.

We then continue our drive along the northern shore of Issyk Kul, the second largest saltwater lake in the world, affectionately known as the "Pearl of the Tien Shan." Along the way, we'll pause for photo stops and stretch our legs with a short walk in the beautiful Grigorievka gorge before reaching Karakol town.

Dinner is a hearty home-cooked Dungan dinner hosted by a local family whose ancestors settled in the region over a century ago, preserving their distinct culinary traditions.

HIKING UP ALTYN ARASHAN, NATURAL HEALING SPRINGS

Today we trek up to Altyn Arashan, one of the true jewels of the Tien Shan mountains. The roughly 14 km route takes about 5 hours at a steady, unhurried pace. The trail is mostly gentle, winding through pine forests and open valleys, with rivers rushing alongside us and snow-capped peaks slowly revealing themselves as we gain altitude. The final stretch brings a more noticeable incline, a satisfying push before arriving in the mountain valley.

At the heart of the valley lie Altyn Arashan's natural hot springs. The pools are modest and sheltered, but the mineral rich waters offer a deeply rewarding soak after the hike. For those feeling adventurous, a quick dip in the icy river nearby provides a sharp and invigorating contrast that leaves you feeling refreshed and very much alive.

Before nightfall, we hop aboard rugged Russian trucks or UAZ 4WDs for the bumpy but scenic ride back down the valley, watching the landscape change as we descend.

JETI ORGUZ FORMATION, BARSKOON, SKAZKA CANYON, EAGLE HUNTING DEMONSTRATION

After breakfast, we set out along the southern shore of Issyk Kul. Our first stop is Jetti Oguz, the striking red sandstone cliffs whose name means “Seven Bulls.” As you admire the formations, your guides will share local folktales that bring their shapes to life.

We continue to Barskoon, where we have a hearty lunch, before driving off to Skazka Canyon. Known as “Fairy Tale Canyon,” its wind-carved formations resemble castles, dragons, and fantastical creatures. The walks here offer endless photo opportunities in a surreal landscape.

As the day winds down, we gather for a sunset eagle hunting demonstration. This ancient tradition is a proud part of Kyrgyz nomadic heritage, showcasing the powerful bond between hunter and eagle. Watching an apex predator in action is a rare and unforgettable glimpse into a living culture.

YURT MAKING WORKSHOP & JOURNEY TO SON-KUL LAKE

One of the trip's true highlights awaits at Song Kul Lake. To fully appreciate it, we first take part in a workshop to learn how yurts are made. More than just practical shelters, yurts carry deep cultural meaning, with every part of the design intertwined with Kyrgyz tradition. You'll even get the chance to join in the process.

From Kochkor, we drive into the mountains toward Song Kul. At over 3,000m, the air is crisp and the weather can be cold even in summer, the only season the lake is accessible. Along the way, you'll see shepherd families who move here with their livestock for the pastures.

As evening falls, we arrive at the lake and settle into our yurt camp. With sweeping plains, grazing herds, and a canopy of stars, Song Kul is an unforgettable glimpse into Kyrgyz nomadic life.

NOMADIC TRADITIONS AT SON-KUL LAKE

There's a deep sense of peace in being surrounded by open steppe, mountains, and sky, with little sign of built-up life. After breakfast, we mount up for a guided two-hour horseback ride to sweeping viewpoints around the lake. Riding alongside these majestic creatures, you'll feel the quiet rhythm of nomadic life and the vastness of the high pastures all around you. We then visit local shepherd families to learn about their way of life during the summer months, when they move here with their livestock.

Later, we gather for a demonstration of traditional games such as kok boru, a spirited test of skill and strength that reflects the resilience of Kyrgyz nomadic heritage. As the sun sets over Song Kul, the stillness of the landscape, the herds grazing nearby, and the absence of digital noise make it clear why many consider this one of Kyrgyzstan's most beautiful places.

SHYRDAK CARPET MAKING IN KOCHKOR, BISHKEK

The journey down from Song Kul Lake takes us back through the mountains and into the lowlands. En route, we stop in Kochkor, where skilled artisans introduce us to the craft of shyrdak carpet making. These vibrant felt carpets, which you've likely sat on throughout the trip, require countless hours of dedication and artistry. Here you'll gain a deeper appreciation for the tradition behind them.

From there, we continue on to Bishkek, the capital city. The contrast is striking: open pastures give way to city streets, Soviet-era architecture stands alongside leafy boulevards, and the pace of life shifts from tranquil to urban. For those keen to explore further, Bishkek has a vibrant nightlife scene, from hidden speakeasies to laid-back craft beer bars.

BISHKEK CITY TOUR, HISTORICAL LANDMARKS, SHOPPING, OSH BAZAR

Back in Bishkek, we set out on a city tour that weaves together history, culture, and daily life. From Ala Too Square to the Manas Sculptural Complex, you'll see landmarks that reflect the nation's past and present.

After lunch, we'll also explore Bishkek's shopping scene, from boutique stores like One Village One Product that have a relatable social impact mission to give back to different village communities around the country to TUMAR that showcases a collection of well designed local products. We also visit the bustling Osh Bazar, where stalls overflow with nuts, teas, honey, jams, spices, and souvenirs.

In the evening, we come together for a final celebratory dinner. It's a moment to share stories, laugh over highlights, and toast the adventures and friendships made along the way; the perfect way to end our Kyrgyz journey.

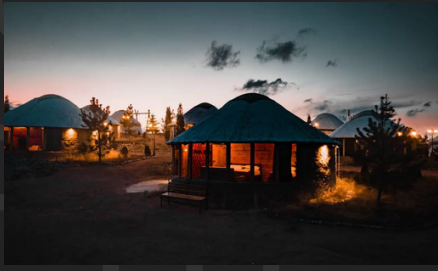
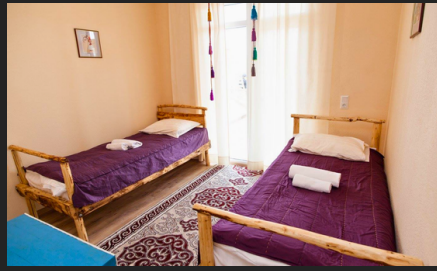

Follow the Trail of Your Adventure

Unlike many typical multi stan programs in Central Asia, we design our journeys to go a little deeper into each country. Nine days will never be enough to see all of Kyrgyzstan, yet it gives us the time to venture beyond Bishkek. We explore the Issyk-Kul region, stay by a beloved alpine lake, and end in the capital city. Shorter trips often stay within reach of a single city, but only by traveling farther can you truly experience what makes each corner special like meeting yurt makers who have mastered their craft for generations, visiting communities known for their champion eagle hunters, and hiking through mountain valleys that reveal a very different side of the country.

Update on Recommended Flights

We recognize the uncertainty and concern that come with periods like this. Like many of you, we are hoping for peace and stability to return to the countries and communities most affected.

Kyrgyzstan remains safe and unaffected by the current situation in the Middle East. The country is geographically distant from the conflict areas, and on the ground all our properties, guides and activity partners continue to operate normally.

The main impact at the moment is not the destination itself, but certain flight corridors. Some Middle Eastern carriers such as Emirates and Qatar Airways have experienced disruptions due to airport or airspace closures in parts of the region. We've compiled some additional flight routes for your consideration:

FREE tours, transfers, meals, and hotel stays for long transits depending on airline! Perfect for killing two birds with one stone!

Flights from Singapore to Bishkek can be long, but both recommended airlines offer programs that make transits more comfortable and enjoyable. Eligibility criteria may apply and can change over time, so while this serves as a useful guide, do check the airlines' official websites for the latest details. We also recommend booking directly with the airline for smoother redemption.

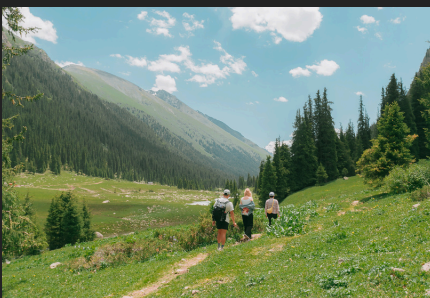
Private trips: Keep the Adventure Going!

We have reserved the following add-ons for private trips, as it is not always easy to fill a longer open group trip. We also know there is a tendency for folks who can afford a few extra days to want to explore the country or the region more deeply. These are some examples of extensions we recommend, and will be happy to suggest others based on your preferences and number of available days.

Additional 1D1N in Altyn Arashan

With the extension on Day 3, the afternoon and evening are spent at an unhurried pace, soaking in the natural hot springs as the air cools and the valley quietens. With no need to descend, the setting feels more intimate as night falls, with simple comforts, shared dinner, and a peaceful night surrounded by the Tien Shan mountains.

The following morning, we cross the clear stream that runs through the valley and spend the day exploring Altyn Arashan on foot or horseback. Away from vehicular tracks, the experience is slow and tranquil, offering glimpses of local shepherd families as they go about their daily routines before we eventually continue our journey.



Additional 2D2N in Kel Suu Lake

After Day 4 in the base program, we add 2D2N in Kel Suu Lake, one of Kyrgyzstan's most spectacular yet remote natural wonders. This stunning alpine lake sits at an altitude of around 3,500 meters in the Naryn region, surrounded by dramatic limestone cliffs, rugged peaks, and narrow gorges. When full, its turquoise-blue waters reflect the surrounding mountains in a way that feels otherworldly.

- **1st additional day:** Drive to Naryn, Yurt Making Workshop
- **2nd additional day:** Drive to Kel Suu, Guided Horse ride to Kel Suu Lake, Boat ride
- **Replace D5 in the original:** Explore Kel Suu Lake, Visit yak shepherds, Drive to Son Kul



Private trips: Keep the Adventure Going!

Additional 4D4N in Kazakhstan

This extension will mean your departure should be from Almaty, Kazakhstan. After wrapping up the first segment of our adventure in Kyrgyzstan, cross into Almaty, then explore some of the Kazakhstan's famous natural landscapes; the striking Charyn Canyon, surreal Kaindy Lake, and tranquil Saty village. Hike between Kolsai I and II Lakes, surrounded by alpine forests and mountain peaks, before returning to the capital for a short city tour and shopping before your departure.

- **Day 9:** (no guides on this day) Cross-border, hotel drop-off, free and easy in Almaty
- **Day 10:** Drive to Charyn Canyon, Kaindy Lake, overnight in Saty village
- **Day 11:** Hike to Kolsai Lake I and Kolsai Lake II, picnic lunch
- **Day 12:** Drive back to Almaty, short city tour, shopping
- **Day 13:** Departure



Alternatively, if the intention is to cover both the best of Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan, we can cover the same stops via a slightly different route. You would effectively save a day (12D11N vs 13D12N), however the cost of both programs is similar. This is because on the day we cross the border near Karakol, we need to account for the services of both local teams, including guides and vehicles on each side. In recent years, cross-border regulations have made it standard practice to operate with in-country teams, ensuring a smooth and fully compliant transition while maintaining the quality of the experience.

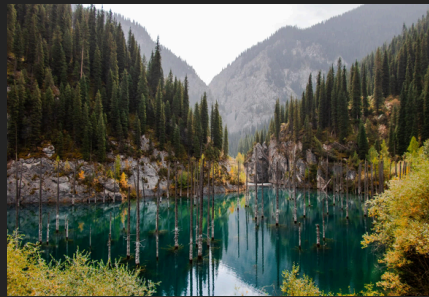
Post group trips: Keep the Adventure Going!

Our Kyrgyzstan program runs as a curated group trip and forms the core of the journey. For those who would like to make the most of being in the region, we offer **optional private add-ons into neighbouring Kazakhstan**. These extensions are designed for guests who want to explore further at their own pace, while keeping the group experience intact for the Kyrgyzstan portion of the trip.

Additional 4D4N in Kazakhstan

This extension will mean your departure should be from Almaty, Kazakhstan. After wrapping up the first segment of our adventure in Kyrgyzstan, cross into Almaty, then explore some of the Kazakhstan's famous natural landscapes; the striking Charyn Canyon, surreal Kaindy Lake, and tranquil Saty village. Hike between Kolsai I and II Lakes, surrounded by alpine forests and mountain peaks, before returning to the capital for a short city tour and shopping before your departure.


- **Day 9:** (no guides on this day) Cross-border, hotel drop-off, free and easy in Almaty
- **Day 10:** Drive to Charyn Canyon, Kaindy Lake, overnight in Saty village
- **Day 11:** Hike to Kolsai Lake I and Kolsai Lake II, picnic lunch
- **Day 12:** Drive back to Almaty, short city tour, shopping
- **Day 13:** Departure



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
